

Statement Against Proposition 3

OUR INITIATIVE GAVE THE PEOPLE THE RIGHT TO DECIDE

Amazingly, over 2100 citizens – 999 were needed – signed petitions for Monroe Initiative #1. Why? Because it simply required the government to ask the voters' permission before it installed for-profit camera surveillance on the citizenry.
